Third Sunday of Easter

Entrance Antiphon: “Cry out with joy to God, all the earth; O sing to the glory of his name. O render him glorious praise, alleluia.” Cf. Ps 66 (65): 1-2

Communion Antiphon: “The disciples recognized the Lord Jesus in the breaking of the bread, alleluia.” Lk 24: 35

Reflection for this Sunday: The readings for the 3rd Sunday of Easter powerfully call us to live lives rooted in obedience to God, heartfelt worship, and genuine love. In the first reading, the apostles demonstrate unwavering courage in the face of persecution, declaring their allegiance to God over human authority. Their boldness encourages us to trust in God and remain faithful, even when doing so is difficult or costly. This obedience, born of deep trust, is the foundation of authentic discipleship. The second reading from Revelation offers a stunning vision of heavenly worship, where angels and all creation give praise to the Lamb—Jesus Christ—emphasizing that worship is at the heart of our relationship with God. Worship not only honors Christ but also draws us into unity with the Church and the world, anchoring us in the joy of divine praise. In the Gospel, Jesus’ threefold question to Peter, “Do you love me?”, calls us to more than verbal affirmation—it demands action. True love for Jesus is expressed in caring for others, living with compassion, and tending to the needs of those around us. Furthermore, this encounter by the Sea of Tiberias reveals a deepening of relationship: Jesus moves from being a distant teacher to a close friend, inviting Peter—and all of us—into a love that is intimate, sacrificial, and lifelong. This moment echoes the humility of the Last Supper and points to the kind of leadership and service Christ calls us to embrace. Altogether, these readings remind us that being followers of Jesus is both a joy and a responsibility: we are to obey God above all, lift our hearts in worship, and live out our love through meaningful action. In doing so, we are transformed from mere followers into friends of Christ, called to walk closely with Him in every aspect of our lives. Lord Jesus, may we always obey Your voice, worship You sincerely, and show our love through selfless care for others. Amen.


