The Most Holy Trinity

Entrance Antiphon: "Blest be God the Father, and the Only Begotten Son of God, and also the Holy Spirit, for he has shown us his merciful love."

Communion Antiphon: "Since you are children of God, God has sent into your hearts the Spirit of his Son, the Spirit who cries out: Abba, Father." Gal 4: 6

Reflection for this Sunday: This Sunday we celebrate the beautiful mystery of the Most Holy Trinity: one God in three Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The readings do not explain the Trinity as an abstract idea, but reveal who God is and how He loves us. In Exodus, God comes down to meet Moses and reveals Himself as "merciful and gracious, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity." Moses responds with worship and asks God to remain with His people, even though they are weak and sinful. In the second reading, St. Paul blesses the Christian community with the grace of Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, reminding us that our faith is rooted in communion, peace, encouragement, and unity. In the Gospel, Jesus reveals the very heart of God: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son," not to condemn the world, but to save it. The Trinity teaches us that God is not distant or cold, but a living communion of love into which we are invited. As children of God, we receive the Spirit of the Son into our hearts, crying out, "Abba, Father." This mystery calls us to reflect God's own life in our families, parish, and community by choosing mercy over judgment, peace over division, and faithful love over selfishness. May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God the Father, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit guide us to live as people of unity, forgiveness, and hope. **Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, draw us more deeply into Your love and help us share that love with everyone we meet. Amen.**

Diocese of Ogdensburg Settlement.

The Diocese of Ogdensburg and the parishes, schools and other Catholic entities within the Diocese ("Catholic Family") have reached an important milestone in the Diocese's Reorganization case. The Catholic Family has reached a settlement in principle with the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors ("Committee"), who represent the interest of the survivors in the Chapter 11 case, under which the Catholic Family will contribute \$45 million to a survivor trust to be formed under the plan of Reorganization ("Plan") to be developed and proposed jointly by the Diocese and the Committee.

The Diocese filed its Chapter 11 case on July 17, 2023, in the Bankruptcy Court for the Northern District of New York to resolve 125 claims of child sexual abuse filed against the Diocese under the Child's Victim Act. The settlement in principle between the Diocese and the Committee is an important first step in forming the Plan that will lead to the Diocese emerging from Chapter 11. The Plan will be subject to a vote of all claimants (including survivors of abuse) and must be confirmed by the Court before its terms will become effective. The Diocese anticipates that the Trust for survivors will also be funded by amounts paid by insurers who provided coverage applicable to the abuse claims asserted against the Parish Family. Any insurance recoveries would be paid to the Trust in addition to the \$45 million to be paid by the Catholic Family. Negotiations with the insurance carriers are ongoing. The Catholic Family will work together to assemble the \$45 million settlement amount. This will include parish savings, diocesan and parish real estate sales, and borrowing. The Diocese will work with parishes and others to determine the sources of funds that will be contributed to the settlement Trust.

Agreement on the monetary settlement marks a significant achievement in this case, but important issues remain. The Diocese and the Committee will continue discussions on non-monetary issues, including details of child protection policies and protocols that will enhance the measures already taken to protect young parishioners, students, and everyone entrusted to the care of the Church in the North Country.

Bishop LaValley stated that, "the Diocese of Ogdensburg is committed to ensuring the safety of all persons entrusted to its care. The great harm caused by this sinful behavior must never be allowed to happen again." Bishop LaValley added, "My hope and prayer is that this process will bring peace and healing to all survivors and to all the faithful whose hearts were broken by the sinful conduct of Church leaders."
